



A Bible Study On Psalm 71 – Prayers for God’s Help in Old Age

Suggested use: To introduce this topic, show the brief video *Tell Me a Story*. It is available for viewing directly from ALOA’s website or can be downloaded for viewing at www.aloaserves.org/resources/videos/tell-me-a-story/

Verses 1-4 Who is my God?

- What does it mean to you that God is your REFUGE?
- What does it mean to you that God is your RESCUE?
- What does it mean to you that God is your ROCK?
- What does it mean to you that God is your FORTRESS?
- What does it mean to you that God is your DELIVERER?

Verses 5-8 What is my confession of faith?

- What does it mean when you confess that God is your hope?
- What does it mean when you confess that God is your confidence?
- What does it mean when you confess that God is your portent?

Portent means “of great importance or significance.”

- What does it mean when you confess that God is your daily praise?

Verses 9-13 An older person’s plea for help

- Are there times when you feel God has cast you away and forsaken you?

- Are there times when people make fun of you and your God?
- Have you felt a time when God seemed far away and not near to help you?
- Have you ever asked God to deal with other people who are giving you trouble?

Verses 14-21 A declaration of God’s grace, hope, and comfort.

- In what ways do you declare that you believe in a God of hope?
- Recall some of the blessings from God during your early years.
- How does one still find hope and comfort when they are old and gray?

Verses 22-24 A response of praise.

- Have you praised God with a musical instrument?
- Share ways that you have experienced the joy of knowing, believing, and living in faith that Jesus is your Savior and Lord.
