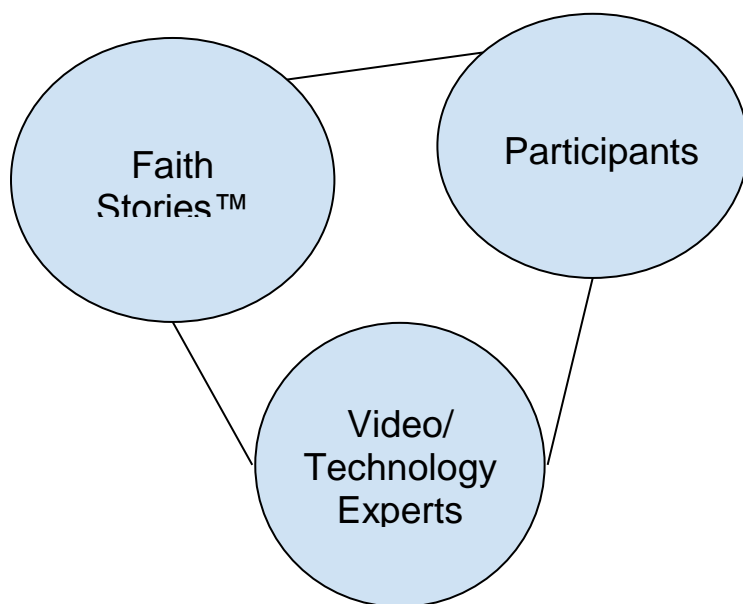


Faith Stories™ Project - Basic Steps:

1. Pitch to congregation - build the culture, inform
2. Recruit participants
3. Connect technology experts with Faith Story™ participants.
4. Set up a date to film
5. Film, edit, and upload
6. Share films with individuals/families
7. Organize an exhibition with all participants

A Faith Stories™ project requires three major players:

1. **A Faith Stories™ Champion** - This person has a passion for seeing faith in Jesus articulated, preserved, and shared. They drive the project details and make connections between the video/technology experts and the participants.
2. **Participants** - These folks are the heroes of the project because they're the ones articulating their faith. They're those people who have decided that it's important to articulate, preserve, and share their individual faith story. They take a risk by making their story public to family or even a larger audience if they desire.
3. **Video/Technology Experts**
(optional): This person or team of people drives the capture of, editing (if desired), and distribution of the Faith Stories™ if video making resources are available. Requires a basic to expert knowledge of video making, preservation, and sharing.
