
And how many of us have discovered new ways to connect with friends and loved ones?



Congregational Help for Strengthening Older Adult Ministry

1. **Explore** the WHY. It is tempting to skip this step. Please don't! Spend time reminding yourself about the importance of the work, in God's eyes, and in the demographics of the community you are in. Don't ignore the elephant in the room!
2. **Affirm** Discipleship. A critical second step is to find ways to affirm Discipleship. There is no retirement from Discipleship! God's call comes early and it comes late. And what a congregation does on Sunday in worship can go a long way to affirming this. Check out two significant resources (Bless the Years, and Milestones Ministry). Show older adults, and the congregation as a whole, that Discipleship at every stage is important. Lift them up, bring them up front in worship, bless them and pray for them. And send them back into their world, and new stage of life with gusto!
3. **Explore** the 5 Ministry Areas and Resources. The demographic of 65 and older is a large and very diverse group. A 'healthy' ministry with and for older adults can look very different from one congregation to the next. However, ALOA has identified 5 Ministry Areas that generally affect everyone and encourages you to give them a look. They provide excellent opportunities for significant ministry among your churches members and also significant opportunities for community connections because everyone experiences the need/challenge. We've attached excellent resources to each Ministry area so you can get right to work in a meaningful way.
4. **Select** your first area to tackle. You don't have to do it all. Starting with one and doing it well will build momentum. Pick an area with the highest need/best chance for success and give it your best shot.
5. **Repeat**. Keep looping back to the WHY! Let that motivate you to additional possibilities.

WEEKLY MILESTONES

Take a moment to tell or think about a recent mountain high and/or valley low in your life.

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- What is something you have accomplished and are proud of?
- How can God use your efforts—your deeds—for others?
- Is it a surprise that God can use your efforts to accomplish God's will on earth? Explain.

DEVOTIONS

Read: Isaiah 45:1-7.

Cyrus is a Persian king. He is not part of God's chosen people through Abraham, Isaac or Jacob. Cyrus doesn't even know the God of Israel, and yet Cyrus does God's will by setting God's people free to return home from exile in Babylon. Isaiah lifts up the supreme power and authority of God's rule throughout the world. Besides the LORD, there is no god (v. 5). All that is, is God's. It is easy for us to forget that God can use others outside of the body of Christ to do God's will on earth. No wonder Psalm 96 commands all the earth to sing to the LORD (v. 1). In the midst of the tragedies that happen all too often around us, it is important to remember that we are a people of hope and trust in the God who holds all things together. The Apostle Paul wrote with thanksgiving for the Thessalonians' faith, love, and hope (1 Thessalonians 1:3). As a chosen people, Paul gladly affirms that they do God's work of love on earth through their "work of faith" and "steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ" (v. 3). How does God's rule on earth give you hope and encourage you to act with love and faith?

Pray: God of power and might, we thank you for your glory that breathes hope and love into all corners of the earth through Christ our Lord. Amen.

SERVICE

God is the ruler of all of creation and we, God's servants, have responsibility to care for all that God has created. One of the greatest concerns for our world today is to care for the earth that is suffering under the weight of carbon emissions, overflowing landfills and polluted air and water. What can you do to reduce the waste that harms the earth?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Psalm 96 is a song of praise to God. It tells of the sea roaring, the creatures and fields rejoicing, and the trees singing. In what ways do you praise God through sounds and music? Sing a favorite Christian hymn. Think about what the words say about God. Then say: Sing a new song to the Lord! Everyone on this earth, sing praises to the Lord, sing and praise his name. (vv.1-2a)





Birthday Milestone Moment

Milestones Ministry brings an awareness of the presence of God to individuals of all generations by recognizing the home as church, too. A Milestone Moment brings family and friends together to mark a special time in their lives and to acknowledge and affirm God's presence in their midst. Milestone Moments provide a model for connecting significant occasions in people's lives with the ongoing Journey of faith. Celebrating a birthday is such an occasion, year brings a time to reflect on the past and look to the future with hopes for the year to come. Families and countries recognize particular birthday years as stepping stones in one's life. In Mexico and Latin America, a young girl's 15th birthday is called the quinceaños. It signals a time when a girl becomes a young woman. In Japan, there is a festival called shichi-go-san (7-5-3) for boys and girls. The 60th birthday and each decade after are also celebrated as special "ages" in one's life. In the United States, turning 16 means being able to drive and turning 18 or 21 is widely celebrated as entering adulthood. People often celebrate the decade birthdays like 30, 40, 50, and beyond. Family recipes and special birthday cakes adorned with candles are a custom for celebrating around the world.

Milestones Ministry uses a simple five stage structure so that the Milestone Moment will have a greater chance to take deeper root in one's lifelong faith formation.

Birthday Milestone Moment provides an opportunity to recognize God's presence in this moment is important. This Birthday Milestone Moment incorporates the five stage structure.

Naming – It is important to recognize a birthday. Whether the person is becoming a teen or turning 90, it is a time to celebrate and name this special occasion.

Equipping – This Milestone Moment encourages caring conversations that help create memories for all generations and honor the birthday person through scripture and prayer.

Blessing – Blessing the honored birthday person at this special time in their life provides memories for years to come.

Gifting – Giving a tangible gift like a framed picture, a birthday stone for gifting, or special gift to honor the occasion will be a visual reminder of this special day for the birthday person.

Reinforcing – It is a good idea to follow up after the Birthday Milestone Moment by sharing memories and having caring conversations during visits with the honored person in the future.

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Birthdays are a time to celebrate the life of someone who is special to you. Every year brings new hopes and dreams. Providing an opportunity to recognize God's presence in this moment is important. This Birthday Milestone Moment incorporates the five stage structure.



Caring Conversations

Process these thoughts and questions:

- **Birthday person:** Tell us some of the joys, challenges and blessings you have experienced.
- **Guests:** Tell a story about the birthday person.
- **Birthday person:** What hopes do you have for the future?
- **Guests:** What hopes do you have for the birthday person?



Devotions

This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. (Psalm 118:24)

God is the creator of all life, including the gift of this day.

- Talk about how this day is a gift from God.
- How has the birthday person been a gift to you?

Pray: Dear God, today we especially thank you for the gift of (name), who is celebrating his/her birthday. We thank you for (name) and for your love for all through the gift of this day. May we respond with joy for the life of (name) and for the gift of life we all share together. In the name of Jesus Christ, your only Son born into the world that we may have life in his name. Amen.



Service

Think of an act of kindness that can be done for the birthday person or be done to honor the birthday person at some point within the next year and write it on slips of paper. Place the slips in a basket and gift them to the honored person.



Rituals and Traditions

Before the traditional birthday cake and opening of gifts, bless the birthday person. Surround the person and hold hands or lay hands on the honored person and bless them:

May the Lord bless you and keep you. May the Lord teach you to count each day so that you may gain a heart of wisdom. (Psalm 90:12)



Light a candle. *Say: Jesus Christ is the light of the world. The light no darkness can overcome.*

Pray: Gracious God, be with all people and nations during this pandemic. Take away our anxiety that we may care for one another and live with peace and hope through Jesus Christ. Amen.

Close with this blessing: *May the peace of Christ bless you with hope and joy.*

Devotions

Read the following:

Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? Matthew 6:25-30 (NRSV)
