Why ENHANCED older adult ministry?

What is our attitude regarding older adults?

Do we view them as a problem? "Oh, no, we have so many seniors!"

OR

Do we view them as an asset? "Oh, great, we have so many seniors with so many gifts for ministry!"

God has saved us by His grace!

He has equipped us to do good works!

Note: No mention of "retirement" or of stopping doing good works.



It's helpful to think of ministry both FOR older adults and WITH older adults

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- Provide devotional and Bible study opportunities and resources for older adults

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- Assess ease of access to your facility
- Hearing assistance
- Large print hymnals, pew Bibles, easily readable screens
- Online worship options: pre-record, livestream



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Offer speakers/workshops on life topics
